

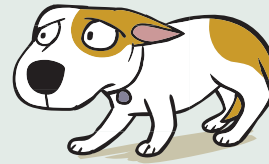
How Kids SHOULD Interact with Dogs

Be polite and kind to pets

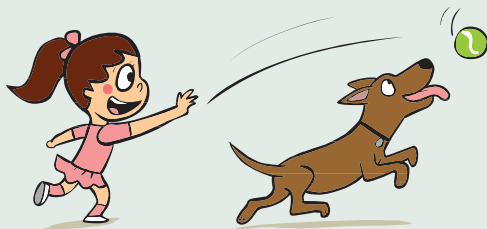


Learn to recognize when your dog is scared or anxious

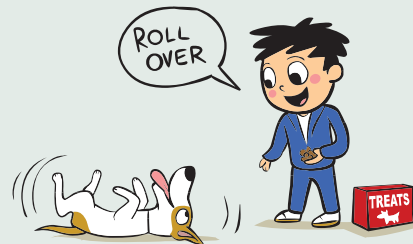


Play appropriate games with pets, such as:

Walking and running with a dog



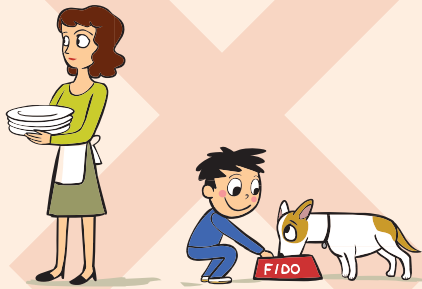
